Firstly, Iba has a higher peak discharge and a shorter lag time because it would likely be in an urban area with lots of impermeable concrete, leading to uncreased surface run off. Whereas 166 will more likely be surrounded by permeable surfaces such as grass, soil and soft rock allowing most water to unfiltrate.

Secondly, there is likely to be more trees in 166 to intercept the rainfall and elongate the lag time, however, in 16a, there will be less vegetation so



Chances of 5+ Grade 9-5 GCSEs including English & Maths





- **4. Mining** large scale mining projects to retrieve minerals such as iron ore, bauxite





At Rossett we follow the AQA course. In this course students will sit three written exams. Each exam is 1 hour and 30 minutes.

Paper 1: Living with the physical environment

Natural hazards (Plate tectonics, Weather and Climate Change), The Living World (Rainforests, Deserts and Ecosystems), UK Landscapes (Coasts and Rivers)

Paper 2: Challenges in the human environment

Urban Issues (Urbanisation, Lagos and Leeds) Economic World (Development gap, Nigeria and UK Economy), Resource Management (Food, water and energy)

Paper 3: Geographical applications

Issue evaluation (pre-exam booklet), Fieldwork, Geographical skills



Use strategies such as: read, cover, write check, brain dumps and making flash cards/mind. maps as part of this process.






